This Study Guide offers learning activities for 4 stories from the writing contest. Activities range from 110 - 130 and can be used across the curriculum.</p>

The resource is meant to help community people interested in literacy develop and deliver a presentation about literacy to other community groups.</p>

	<p>Language of the Land A resource manual for individuals and community groups interested in Aboriginal language development work. There is an on-line learning resource called <i>Lessons from the Land</i> www.lessonsfromtheland.ca. This interactive site allows you to travel the Idaa Trail and learn more about the traditions and culture of the Dogrib people. The study guide provides extended learning activities.</p>

	<p>Simply Math This resource is part of the Everyday Math Skills series and provides resources on the basic skills that are needed to do math questions correctly. These skills include adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing.</p>
