Family Literacy Training Institute

Yellowknife, Nov. 29 - Dec. 4, 2010

This is for people who are new to family literacy. Workshops include: Introduction to Family Literacy, 1-2-3 Rhyme With Me, Books in the Home, Family Literacy Nights and Bookmaking.
